**Item 1 : Confirmation of minutes of the 16th meeting of the C-PR&P held in Sacramento, USA on 1 October 2007**

*(The 17th meeting of C-PR&P at Lahore in October 2008 could not take place due to scarce attendance of its members.)*

The minutes of the 16th meeting of the Committee held at Sacramento in October 2007 will be confirmed.

**Item 2 : Review of membership**

At Sacramento (2007), nomination of Mr. A.K. Ganju (India) in place of Mr. B.S. Ahuja for the membership was deferred since he was not present. The Central Office in February and July 2009 requested the Indian National Committee (INCID) to confirm above nomination or propose a new name. Response is awaited.

Attendance of the members at the meetings of the Committee held in 2007 and 2008 will be presented during the meeting. It may be noted that representation of a member of the working group by any other representative of the concerned national committee is not deemed to be a contribution by a member. Refer to Annex 1 of PCSPOA of Agenda (page A-9) and ICID By-law 3.1.7 which stipulates that members not contributing to the activities by attendance or correspondence for two consecutive years shall be replaced in consultation with their National Committees.

Accordingly, members who neither attended the meetings nor made any contributions for the last two consecutive years are:

- VPH Dr. Dia El-Din Ahmed El-Quosy (Egypt);
- Prof. Atef Hamdy (Italy);
- Prof. Hseih, Yung-Hsu (Chinese Taipei); and
- Ir. Paul van Hofwegen (The Netherlands)

The concerned National Committees (NCs) were requested in February and July 2009 to provide fresh nominations with the assurance that the new nominee would contribute to the Committee's activities. Responses from them are awaited.

Ir. Paul van Hofwegen (The Netherlands) has informed that he has joined the World Bank (Indonesia) and as such can no longer represent the Netherlands in the Committee. He can, however, become an observer on the Committee representing the World Bank.

**A. CONTINUING ITEMS****Item 3 : Publications brought out and under processing****3.1 Publications brought out during the period 2007-2009**

The main ICID publications which were brought out during the period 2007-2008 under regular category are:

- Four issues of quarterly ICID Newsletters;
- 12 issues of monthly ICID News Updates and
- Annual Reports of ICID 2007-08 and 2008-09

**Newsletter**

During the 16th meeting of C-PR&P held at Sacramento (2007), PH Peter S. Lee made following remarks on ICID Newsletter:

- The C-PR&P should become active in reviewing the Newsletter, offering suggestions for improving its quality.
- NCs should be invited to review the number of copies of the Newsletter that they receive, with a goal of increasing circulation within ICID.
- The Newsletter should receive a wider distribution outside the ICID too.

The Committee members may note.

As a result of follow-up actions on Newsletter, views from the NCs of Australia (ANCID), Canada (CANCID), UK (ICID.UK) and India (INCID) obtained are reproduced below:

1. ANCID:

ANCID shown readiness to assist in promoting the Newsletter by way of putting the Newsletter link on their website that receives around more than 5000 hits in a month.

2. CANCID:

We need to turn the Newsletter from narrow social news to an industry oriented news gathering and dissemination tool. For attaining the objective, the Newsletter should include:

- News of new irrigation technologies, products and techniques reported upon elsewhere but has some usefulness to ICID members/readership;
  - New publications, not necessary ICID ones, that has been recently been published on the subject of interest to ICID;
  - Summary of national, regional and continental events related to irrigation whether sponsored or not sponsored by ICID; and
  - The CO can use its staff to do the research compilation of these items and certainly NCs will be able to chip in slowly to supply the future bulk of information once they realize there is a credit given to them by doing so.
3. ICID.UK: Requested 140 copies of the Newsletter so as to help them to pass on to the members with their own newsletter.
4. INCID: Professionals not affiliated with ICID be given opportunity to receive the ICID Newsletter upon request.

Options available could be:

- Permit the individual NC to download and multiply as many copies as they require and circulate it either in electronic mode or in hard copy version as they like.
- A fresh assessment initiative - ascertaining number of copies to be printed to cope up with the additional requirement of each NC.
- Mailing of Newsletter in bulk to individual NCs for further redistribution to their members.
  - This will cost courier or snail mail charges and offset the advantage for going for printing all copies in one source (in Delhi) as mailing cost will be substantial.
  - Examining the reprinting possibility at each NC's place (once the approved version is either uploaded on the website or sent by airmail) and circulating it within the region concerned.

### ***News Update***

President Hon. Bart Schultz suggested that news from the News Update be published on the ICID website in the form of a brief coverage of one paragraph.

### ***Annual Report***

The ICID Annual Reports 2007-08 and 2008-09 will be tabled during the meeting of the Committee. Customarily, the Annual Report is distributed to NCs and to a limited external mailing list. Extra copies of the Annual Reports are available upon request from the CO, ICID in New Delhi.

While taking follow-up actions, the CO received requisitions for additional copies of Annual Report (2007-08) 5, 12 and 10, respectively from the NCs of India, Philippines and Australia. The CO has since mailed the additional copies to the concerned NCs.

CANCID also extended their views on ICID Annual Report as below:

Annual Report should take ICID one step closer to being a Global Professional Institution. As such the Annual Report should include:

- A chapter on global review of the irrigation, drainage and flood control in the preceding year.
- A summary of highlight of related issues: agriculture, production, trade, food deficit surpluses and climate variability through the regions in the year.
- Key new technologies or breakthrough in research and development.
- ICID position in the global and regional and national focus. What happened in past year at each level and what were ICID contributions – success stories where it can be found.
- The corporate reporting: membership, finances etc. will remain as is for now.

**Item 4 : Sale of publications/Congress Transactions during the period 2007-2009**

**4.1 Sale of Publications**

A statement showing the sale of ICID publications during the period 2007-2009 is placed at **Annex 2**.

**4.2 Sale of Congress Transactions**

The Committee during the last meeting quoting the ICID By-laws 5.9.1(a) – Obligation of the host National Committee for a Congress, Symposium, Special Session, Seminar etc. mentioned that the procedures for printing Congress Transactions should be taken up in such a way that the Central Office can recover the full cost of production and shipping of transactions to Congress Organizing Committee and the host National Committee is expected to pay full cost for all of the transactions that they order.

ICID By-laws 5.9.3 and 5.9.4 also stipulate the procedure to be followed for transactions that are to be ordered from the Central Office and supplied to them. By provision 5.9.4(c), the sets of transactions once supplied, shall be non-returnable. The National Committees hosting the Congress are obliged to meet the full cost of the excess copies (including airmail charges), if the ordered copies are more than the number of delegates registering for the Congress.

The matter was discussed with Dr. Illahi B. Shaikh, the then Chairman/Convenor, C-CONGR in 2008 and the then Chairman, PANCID, the host National Committee of the 20th Congress of ICID. PANCID agreed to keep this matter in view. The Central Office is in contact with PANCID to recover the full cost of transactions for 20th Congress. Response is awaited.

The Committee members may deliberate.

**Item 5 : Report of Joint Editors of ICID Journal**

Ten issues of peer reviewed Journal were released during the period 2007 to 2008 (two years) with a total coverage of 1228 pages. The Special Issues published were:

- “Drainage – An Essential Element of Integrated Water Management’ (Vol. 56, Suppl 1) was published on the occasion of 25th Anniversary of the ICID Working Group on Drainage.
- ‘Capacity Building for Agricultural Water Management’ in cooperation with ICID Working Group on Capacity Building was published as Issue 57.3.

In 2009, 382 pages have been published up to Issue 58.3. The following special issues have also been published in 2009:

- *The Water Professional of Tomorrow, (Issue 58.2)* based on reviewed papers of the NETHCID symposium and published in co-operation with Wageningen University
- *Water and Food for Ending Poverty and Hunger* at the occasion of the 5th World Water Forum (*Issue 58.3*);
- *Irrigation Management in North Africa, (Special Issue 58.3)* based on papers prepared in the framework of the SIRMA (Irrigation Systems for Maghreb) project. Published together with the Centre de Coopération Internationale en Recherche Agronomique pour le Développement (CIRAD), France.

The EB-Journal monitors ICID’s Journal exclusively. A detailed report/agenda by Chair, EB-Journal is available at Page A-195.

**Item 6 : Review of website**

ICID website provides instant access to a wide range of information on ICID’s objectives and aims, organizational set-up, membership, international cooperation, information exchange, publications and price list, forthcoming events

and E-library through Text Delivery Service (TDS). The ICID website also incorporates most recent issues of the monthly News Update, quarterly Newsletter, Annual Report and other special reports on a regular basis.

The Advertisers Catalogue that has been established provides a platform for the manufacturers, consultants, contractors, educational/research institutions, conferences/exhibitions of organizers to display their company information to ICID. Advertisers in ICID Newsletter and Irrigation and Drainage Journal are provided with a free listing under this section to highlight their company portfolios.

Information related to vacancies in water related organizations can also be viewed in this section, if available.

An average 16,000 hits per month were recorded on ICID website.

#### **Item 7 : Establishment of webpages by Workbodies**

The Central Office has hired an additional space on a server and registered a domain name [www.icidonline.org](http://www.icidonline.org) for enabling the Workbodies to access their webpages. A File Transfer Protocol (FTP) has also been made available to each Chair for providing them a free hand to upload and amend any information related to the workbody.

CO as a follow-up action requested to all the Workbody Chairs for taking needful actions. Committee members may deliberate and make suggestions to improve the webpages further.

**Item 8 : Review of quarterly Newsletter**

PH Peter Lee requested that a small Work Team be constituted to take charge of reviewing and commenting on the Newsletter, following each issue. Mr. Stephen Mills (Australia), VPH Javad Farhoudi (Iran), VPH Alain Vidal (France) and Ms. Anne Currey (Australia) agreed to serve in the review team.

Accordingly, the Central Office forwarded earlier issues of the quarterly ICID Newsletters to the members of the constituted Work Team to review and provide comments on the Newsletter issues.

The comments received were:

**Anne Currey (Australia)**

A number of elements of the newsletter are good, i.e. the three-paragraph format, the use of photographs and graphics to highlight or illustrate points made in text, and the newsworthy content.

Suggestions for improvement are:

- Format: As most of the readers of the newsletter read it on screen rather than printing it off the format should be changed to a horizontal one so that the whole page is viewable on a computer screen to enhance readability.
- Newsletter length: The two issues of the newsletter received were of different lengths i.e. 8 and 12 pages. It is preferable that each issue is of having the same length and would suggest to go in for 8 pages. A longer one gets away from the purpose of a newsletter.
- Organize the content in clearly identifiable sections, e.g. feature article, ICID update (news from ICID members), President's message, general news items, technology, events and conference diary, and contact details, to make for easier reading. The content for these sections is already presented in the Newsletter; however, it is not organized in that way.
- Most news worthy article (the feature) should be on page 1. While the message from the President is important, page 1 is a crucial page in terms of inviting people to read the newsletter and demonstrating that ICID is at the forefront of innovation and information provision. The President's message, which could go on page 2 or 3, may support that with the information he provides.
- For many readers of the newsletter, English could be a second language. For this reason, close attention must be paid on the how articles are written so as to ensure that they are accessible to all readers. The content of the newsletters is interesting; however, if it is written in a very formal style, it makes the readers "work" too hard. The language used in articles should be carefully edited to ensure they are easier to read. This can be done without losing any of the technical impact of the articles. More, shorter, articles would also contribute to readability.
- The name of the newsletter, ICID newsletter, doesn't say anything about ICID or contribute to its branding and profile. Perhaps you could consider a reader competition to find a new name?

**Vice President Hon. Alain Vidal (France)**

*"I really like the format, the balance between ICID internal news and external contributions in the form of brief articles with links to more detailed content, as well as the presence of advertising which helps support the cost"*

Some more suggestions were:

- an "innovation corner" where new technical or institutional ideas (even non conformist ones) and open it for discussion
- a "readers corner" where people from inside and outside community could express themselves on a burning issue
- a young professionals' corner dedicated to YPF activities.

Committee members may deliberate and make suggestions to improve the Newsletter further.

## **B. NEW ITEMS**

### **Item 9 : Procedure to be followed for bringing out ICID position as publications**

In a few cases, the intended version has recently been published in 'Irrigation and Drainage' as papers – with an indication as it is the 'ICID position'. Reproduction of the contents of papers, once published in ICID Journal, infringes 'Copy Rights'.

A problem arises when the request of not only NCs for more copies of ICID Position Papers are demanded and also request for 'exchange' with other international/ national organization comes up to enhance ICID visibility.

The Committee may wish to consider if a special group should be constituted to come up with a 'policy' that should be followed for such cases and if they could be in tune with By-Law 6.2 which can help to comply requirements under By-Law 6.3.

ICID By-laws 6.2 deal with Special Publications and 6.3 on complementary copies.

#### **“6.2 Special Publications**

Apart from the publications mentioned in By-law (6.1), the Transactions for each Congress and Proceedings of regularly scheduled Technical Sessions at the Congress, all other publications shall be termed Special Publications (comprising Congress publications and special technical publications) and shall be undertaken with the specific approval of the Council. Specifications regarding the use of the ICID logo and other details shall also be approved by the Council. When according such approval, the Council shall also approve such expenditure as may be required for the preparation of the publication including expenditure on special officers and staff, if any, required in this connection in the Central Office. The Council shall also approve the manner of financing this expenditure.

#### **6.3 Complimentary Copies**

The Central Office shall supply complimentary copies, as follows to:

- (a) All National Committees subject to the provision of Article 5.8 shall receive the ICID Bulletins/ Journal, Annual Bibliography and Annual Report, as determined by the Council from time to time; and one copy each of (1) the Transactions of every Congress including Proceedings of regularly scheduled Technical Sessions at the Congresses, etc., and (2) every Special Technical publication.
  - (b) Host National Committee of a Congress: 10 sets of Transactions of the Congress including regularly scheduled Technical Sessions at the Congress held along with it.
  - (c) Office Bearers: A copy each of all publications.
  - (d) Past Office-bearers except from those countries who have ceased to be participating countries: A copy each of the ICID Bulletins/ Journal and other publications specifically requested. Unless renewed this commitment shall lapse after three years.
  - (e) All members of Committees and Working Groups: As the Secretary General may consider necessary for the performance of the duties entrusted to them.
-

- (f) Authors of papers and articles: (i) Ten (10) copies of preprints of their own papers submitted for the Congress, the Special Session and the Symposium and of off prints of Articles published in the ICID Journal or the ICID Technical Memoirs, etc. (ii) A copy each of the ICID Journal or ICID Technical Memoirs in which paper or article has been published.
- (g) Authors or editors/ compilers of special publications: Three copies of special publications to each.
- (h) Experts of Panels: One volume of the concerned Question/ Theme.”

**Item 10 : Revision of ICID publications and sale price**

**10.1 Revision of ICID publications**

There are about 30 ICID publications which were published by the year 2000. Some of the publications were well received by various National Committees and stakeholders. As the publications are not revised after their first release, some are lying in bulk quantity. Equally a few are out of stock. The details of the publications are shown at **Annex 3**.

The Committee in its 16th meeting (2007) recommended that ICID Workbodies be reminded to review the ICID publications and to make recommendations for updating the existing publications or to recommend new publication initiatives.

CO circulated the list to all Workbody Chairs. Response is awaited. An update on responses, if any, will be given during the meeting.

**10.2 Revision of sale price of ICID publications**

Recently, CO received some communications from government departments, private institutions and publishing companies for rebate in ICID publications. When ICID provides 50% discount for its publications to NCs/members and booksellers, the rebate applicable to government departments who serves the farming communities at large, especially in developing countries is not dealt with. Recently, a request from one such agency was looking for such concessions.

C-PR&P may like to consider and recommend the rebate for government departments; also mode of acceptance of amount either through dollars/euros/Indian currency via bank draft or credit card.

**COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC RELATIONS AND PUBLICATIONS (C-PR&P)**
