



From Secretary General's Desk...



Dear Colleagues,

To realign its vision and mission with the UN Sustainable Development Agenda 2030, ICID readjusted its mission to **“Facilitate prudent agriculture water management by encouraging interdisciplinary approaches to irrigation and drainage management”**. The mission of ICID is proposed to be achieved by generating new knowledge, compiling and collating information, sharing experiences and good practices, disseminating the new knowledge and capacity development of the relevant stakeholders.

In this connection, I would like to draw your attention to the UN World Data Forum held its first meeting in South Africa earlier this month which has laid emphasis on the need to have accurate, reliable, and timely data to achieve sustainable development goals. ICID has been collecting such data related to agriculture water management for many years. However, it's time that we give the process of collecting this

data, that will also support identifying irrigation and drainage contribution to sustainable development. I am sure that concerned Working Groups will take note of the outcomes of the important World Data Forum.

Number of approaches and tools are available to undertake capacity development and sharing of knowledge, which include conducting training programs, developing e-Learning modules, organizing webinars (web-based seminars) etc. We have been using web-conferencing for a couple of years.

This year in 2017, we are starting ICID Webinar Series (refer page 2). Management Board took this decision in its recently concluded Virtual Meeting. The ICID Webinars Series will be used for involving large number of stakeholders beyond irrigation and drainage fraternity, which otherwise is not possible, in ICID activities and disseminate and share our experiences across the continents. The possibilities are limitless. Many other professional organizations are using this tool suiting their own requirements. It is for us to customize according to our needs and use it effectively. I solicit support and suggestions from all our patrons.

Shortly, we will issue the schedule of the first ICID Series of Webinars slated for the run up to the 23rd ICID Congress, scheduled for 8-15 October 2017 in Mexico City. We encourage our patrons to make best use of this opportunity, particularly for those who for some reasons are unable to join the physical meetings.

Subsequent to our meeting in Chiang Mai we have received encouraging response from our NCs and their inputs, which Consultative Group will take into account and start finalizing the ICID Action Plan 2030. However, we encourage the NCs who have not submitted the questionnaire yet to do so as your feedbacks in whatever form act as beacons in our efforts to provide you the required services.

NCs and Working Groups play a key role in our efforts to achieve our mission. In this Congress year, we recognize the good work being done by them through the Best Performing National Committee and Best Performing Working Group Awards. Call for nominations have been issued for these Awards.

Please note that as a followup of the decision taken in the 67th IEC regarding the change of Bank accounts for ICID to receive foreign remittance, we had requested our NCs to not to send remittance of membership fee without receiving subscription invoice. I am happy to inform that we have now settled that and we have started issuing the subscription invoices with the revised Bank Account numbers.

Wishing the ICID fraternity a very fruitful and effective networking and sharing during 2017 and beyond.

UN Data Forum opens in South Africa to harness power of data for sustainable development

The inaugural United Nations World Data Forum kicked off on 15 January 2017 in the South African city of Cape Town, bringing together more than 1,500 data experts from more than 100 countries, with the aim of building broad consensus on how to harness the power of data for sustainable development.

Organized by the UN in cooperation with the South African government, the four-day gathering also aimed at rallying support behind a new global action plan.

To achieve sustainable development, it is essential to have accurate, reliable, timely and disaggregated data. This will require everyone in the statistics and data community – from governments, the private sector, the scientific and academic communities and civil society – to find

ways to work across different domains and create partnerships and synergies”.

The 2030 Agenda was adopted by world leaders in September 2015 at an historic UN summit. A key component of the agenda is the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which came into force on 1 January 2016, and which set out new 15-year targets for global efforts to end all forms of poverty, fight inequalities and tackle climate change, while ensuring that no one is left behind.

The 2030 Agenda poses enormous challenges for the global statistical community, to modernize and improve our capacity, so that all national statistical offices become the new data hubs for data sources from across many different data systems and provide the necessary data to



inform policies, and for national, regional and global monitoring.

“To make this happen, we will need governments, international organizations, businesses, academia and civil society to join forces and work together,” he said.



New Addition for Knowledge Dissemination

In order to realize the ICID Vision 2030 which has set six organizational goals for the network: (i) Enable more crop per drop, (ii) Be a catalyst for change in policies and practices, (iii) Facilitate technology exchange, (iv) Enable cross disciplinary dialogue, (v) Support development of tools to convert research and innovation into field implementation, and (vi) Facilitate capacity development, ICID is starting ICID Webinar Series.

Recent ICID meetings have seen lot of discussion on strengthening capacity building activities in irrigation and drainage sector. During the 67th IEC meeting at Chiang Mai in November 2016, different workbodies agreed that Webinars can be used as an efficient tool to disseminate and share knowledge and vast expertise available within and outside the ICID fraternity. Members supported the idea of organizing Webinars, to be coordinated by ICID Central Office.

Webinar (short for Web-based seminar) will be in the form of presentation, lecture, workshop or seminar that will be transmitted over the Web using video conferencing software. Webinars allow groups in remote geographic locations to listen and participate in the same conference regardless of the geographic distance between them. The key feature of these Webinars will be their interactive elements: the ability to give, receive and discuss information in real-time. Participants will be able to share audio, documents and

applications with webinar attendees.

ICID Webinars will also be recorded for later viewing (sans of course the interactive elements) and will be available on ICID media. In this sense, a recorded webinar becomes a webcast.

Before starting a Webinar, members/patrons will be informed of the contents and target audience of the webinar through ICID communication channels.

ICID propose to host Webinars on Citrix platform (GoToWebinar), which provides a complete and integrated portfolio of Workspace-as-a-Service, application delivery, virtualization, mobility, network delivery and file sharing solutions that are securely available to users via the cloud or on premise and across any device or platform.



Collaboration between CNCID and PANCID

Vice President Waseem Nazir (Pakistan) visited Chinese National Committee on Irrigation and Drainage (CNCID) at Beijing, China after becoming the Vice President of ICID on 29th November 2016 for strengthening cooperation between CNCID and Pakistan National Committee on Irrigation and Drainage (PANCID). VP Nazir was well received by President Hon. Dr. Gao Zhanyi (China) and Dr. Ding Kunlun (China), Vice President of ICID and Deputy Secretary General of CNCID.

During the meeting, strengthening of cooperation between PANCID and CNCID on matters of mutual interest and strengthening relationship between

Drainage and Environmental Sustainability

The 13th Inter-national Drainage Workshop (IDW13) will be organized by the Iranian National Committee on Irrigation and Drainage (IRNCID) under the patronage of the International Commission on Irrigation and Drainage (ICID) and the auspices of the Ministry of Energy (MoE) and its subsidiary Khuzestan Water and Power Authority (KWPA), Islamic Republic of Iran, from 4-7 March 2017 at Ahwaz, Iran.

Activities of INCSW during 2016

The following activities were held by INCSW in addition of India Water Week 2016 successfully organized with

participation from Asian Development Bank, FAO, IWMI and World Bank. In the field of Research, INCSW has been handling around 92 research schemes under progress in various organizations in the country with funding from the Ministry of Water Resources, River Development and Ganga Rejuvenation (MoWR, RD & GR). 2nd R&D Session of INCSW was organized on 5th September 2016 in New Delhi. The session highlighted the role of R&D in water sector in developed countries and requirement of environmental flows in water resources projects and water conflict management. INCSW organised an innovation session on ‘New Technology’ in collaboration with TERI and M/s. Yellow Tropus Pvt. Ltd on ‘Evaporation Control from Reservoirs using Floating Solar Panels on 21 December 2016 at CWC. The Session highlighted the water savings and energy production on the idle water surface areas.

PANCID (Pakistan)

On 26 December 2016, a Consultative Meeting was organized by Pakistan National Committee on Irrigation and Drainage (PANCID) Secretariat under the Chairmanship of Engr. Asjad Imtiaz Ali in Islamabad, Pakistan for revitalization of PANCID activities and interactive session with Vice President Mr. Waseem Nazir. Twenty-two members participated from all over the country, including the Heads of various organizations. PANCID members congratulated, Mr. Waseem Nazir and appreciated long-time association of Mr. Waseem Nazir with PANCID as an active member from private sector and lauded his technical contributions in the water-sector development in the country.

VP Waseem Nazir made a detailed presentation on ‘ICID Vision and Current Initiatives’ which were discussed during the 67th IEC meetings held at Chiang Mai, Thailand, November 2016. He informed the Forum, that the members

of ICID play a key role in identifying improved practices in core areas of irrigation, drainage and flood management and help promoting them through their personal efforts/national committees. He emphasized on strengthening the role of PANCID activities. During the meeting, it was decided to make PANCID website more vibrant and designate focal persons from PANCID member organizations for more effective contribution. It was also decided that PANCID would hold meetings in each provincial capital for the meaningful interaction and valuable technical input from provincial stakeholders. In this regard, the first meeting would be organized at Karachi, Pakistan in March 2017. It was also decided that two questionnaires regarding Revitalization Strategies of PANCID and Key Strategic Goals of PANCID's Revitalization would be completed by all PANCID members and sent it to PANCID Secretariat within two weeks' time. A proposal on financial sustainability of PANCID and annual business plan would be developed by a Committee and presented in the next meeting of PANCID.

Mr. Naseer Ahmed Gillani, Chief (Water), Planning Commission emphasized that water needs to be given due priority in the national agenda and assured full support from the Planning Commission to further the activities of PANCID. Representatives of PANCID Organizations have assured their full support in revitalizing PANCID activities. Chair appreciated the spirit of PANCID members for their cooperation.
