



From Secretary General's Desk...



Dear Colleagues,

Water scarcity is likely to be a major challenge for agriculture, a major consumer of water, for food production. It will intensify adversely as a result of climate change. Supporting countries in adapting agricultural systems to conditions of increasing water scarcity and changing climate is not feasible for any one organization. Realizing this FAO has proposed to use the combined expertise and resources of its partners, including ICID under a Global Framework for Water Scarcity (GFWS).

The objective of the framework is to benefit farmers and rural communities by making them resilient to increasing water scarcity. The initiative plans to build partnerships between water stakeholders at the national level, among countries and among key international bodies involved in agricultural water management. The framework will assist countries in identifying and streamlining policies, governance and practices with a view to sustainably improve agricultural productivity and food security.

It may be recalled that Ministers, participating in the roundtable meeting, during the Second World Irrigation Forum hosted by THAICID in Chaing Mai,

November 2016, had establish a High Level Advisory Group on "Partnerships for Agriculture Water Management" as an action-oriented multi-stakeholder partnership to facilitate improving agricultural water productivity, especially in irrigated areas where the competition for water is intensifying and/or water supplies are becoming less reliable. The two initiatives can be complimentary and ICID as a partner in GFWS will make efforts to bring synergy between the two initiatives.

The 23rd ICID Congress with theme "Modernizing Irrigation System for Second Green Revolution" will also indirectly address the concerns of growing water scarcity and thereby lay emphasis on improving irrigation services. Preparations for the 23rd ICID Congress are in full swing. The last date for submission of the full length papers is **15 June 2017** and the registration for the Congress is now open. Patrons may like to take advantage of 'Early Bird Registration' rates by registering before **15 July 2017**.

As you are aware, ICID has started Webinar Series, which is addressing the 23rd ICID Congress theme 'Modernization of irrigation systems'. Two such Webinars have already taken place and the third on 'Benchmarking of Irrigation Systems' is scheduled on 7 June 2017. NCs may like to make use of this opportunity by taking international experts to their network within their own country and encourage their members to join these Webinars. Some NCs have reported combined viewing of the Webinars, followed by discussions on the topic in local language. I am sure such combined watching will provide NCs an opportunity to organize technical events around these topics and get in touch with their members and make NC and ICID and its activities more visible within their country.

ICID will be celebrating its 68th Foundation Day which falls on 24th June. It provides an opportunity for the NCs to interact with its stakeholders within the country. I look forward to receive feedback from NCs on how they utilized the Foundation Day in communicating with their members.

I congratulate the Working Groups on WG-ENV and WG-IOA for actively involving their members through WebEx and thereby take forward their activities. May I remind Chairs of other WGs also that they can take advantage of the WebEx tool and organize inter-sessional meeting of the WG. This will not only help them take their agenda forward, but will also encourage more members to join WG meetings during IEC.

Congratulations are also due to the coordinators of the ICID Young Professionals e-Forum (IYPeF), who have made use of IYPeF and are undertaking e-discussions on topics of their interest. I appeal to all the experts to participate in the discussions as mentors where feasible.

Let me remind our patrons that last date for receiving the nominations for Best Performing National Committee Award and Best Performing Working Group Award are due by the end of this month. National Committees may also note that the last date for receiving the nominations for WatSave Awards is also fast approaching.

Global Framework for Water Security

A two-day Partners Meeting on “Coping with Water Scarcity in Agriculture: A Global Framework for Action in a Changing Climate” was organised by Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) from 19-20 April 2017 at Rome, Italy. The objective of the meeting was to bring the partners and key stakeholders together to define the ‘mechanics’ behind the Global Framework; invite suggestions for implementation of Global Framework for Water Security (GFWS) in terms of development of vision and mission, objectives and priorities; governance structure; membership and sectoral coverage; roadmap, milestones, portfolio and resource mobilization; and issue of the Rome Statement on Water Scarcity in Agriculture. More than 100 participants from about 50 organizations and national Governments participated in the meeting.

Er. Harish Kumar Varma, Executive Director of ICID and Dr. Arcieri Marco, Secretary General, Italian National Committee (ITAL-CID) represented ICID in the meeting

and briefly presented ICID’s suggestions on GFWS and an overview of ICID’s initiatives and programmes which could support aims and objectives of GFWS such as Capacity development programme – training, webinars, e-Learning modules, and scholarship to young professional; ICID Young Professional e-Forum (IYPeF); ICID Awards, especially WatSave, which act as an incentive to development of innovations and technology for water saving in agriculture; World Irrigation Forum as a platform for all stakeholders in Agriculture Water Management, knowledge sharing

VISION of GFWS is a world whose food systems are secure and resilient to increasing water scarcity in a changing climate and

MISSION is to support measurable, significant and sustainable progress on improving and adapting agricultural systems in conditions of increasing water scarcity

and a changing climate, using the combined expertise and resources of its partners.

OBJECTIVES of GFWS are to urgently address the most important and relevant work areas related to increasing water scarcity at international and country levels which include: (i) Need for setting political priorities, (ii) Cooperation on work programmes, (iii) Sharing and dissemination knowledge and experience, (iv) Developing

new and improved solutions, (iv) Promoting sustainable and integrated water resources management, (v) Building capacity of partners, countries and other stakeholders, and (vi) Monitoring and evaluation of the programme.

To implement the programme, a two tier governance structure consisting of a Steering Committee (SC) with representatives from national governments, UN agencies,

academic institutions, research and network organisations and Staff Team at FAO acting as Secretariat to GFWS. ICID has been nominated as one of the member of the interim steering committee set up. At the end of the meeting a non-binding consensus statement was issued as The Rome Statement on Water Scarcity in Agriculture. A two-day Second Stakeholder Consultation Meeting of the 8th World Water Forum (WWF8) was held from 26-27 April 2017 at Brasilia, Brazil. Mr. Masao Miyazaki,

Secretary General of Japanese National Committee of ICID (JNC-ICID), Mr. Fumihiko Onodera (Japan) and Dr. Paulo Romano, representative from Brazil National Committee (ABID) represented ICID during the meeting. More than 800 participants from several countries and representatives of various stakeholder sectors attended the 2nd Stakeholders Consultation Meeting on water management. This event was part of the preparatory process of the 8th World Water Forum on the theme “Sharing Water” which will be held from 18-23

Two e-Learning Courses on Water Footprint Assessment: Concept and Application

The ‘Water Footprint Assessment: Concept and Application’ e-Learning course is a self-taught online foundation course facilitated by experts from the Water Footprint Network and the University of Twente. This online course is one of the most effective tools for understanding the fundamentals of Water Footprint Assessment and how it can be used by consumers, business, policymakers, government representatives and non-governmental institutions. This three week course developed with the support from the World Bank Institute and the University will be offered from 10 July to 31 July 2017 and 13 November - 4 December 2017. The aims of the course is to provide participants with an introduction to the concept and application, with five modules – (i) Water Footprint Concept and Application; (ii) Global Water Management; (iii) Government Policy; (iv) Corporate Strategy; (v) Calculating the Water Footprint. The course involves both

self-paced learning and online discussion facilitated by experts.

It addresses key challenge for which two Sustainable Development Goals (SDG's) have set ambitious targets: SDG 6, target 3: "by 2030, improve water quality by reducing pollution, eliminating dumping and minimizing release of hazardous chemicals and materials, halving the proportion of untreated wastewater and substantially increasing recycling and safe reuse globally", and SDG 12, target 5: "by 2030, substantially reduce waste

generation through prevention, reduction, recycling and reuse". These are two of the 169 SDG targets, many of which, along with the 2015 Paris Agreement on climate change and the annual Global Risks Reports launched by the World Economic Forum in Davos, highlight our challenge to achieve sustainable development in a changing world. World Water Day 2017 Celebrations

Bangladesh (BANCID)

The Bangladesh National Committee of ICID (BANCID) organized a Seminar on the theme "Wastewater" on 28 March 2017 in association with Bangladesh Water



Development Board (BWDB), Institute of Water Modeling (IWM) and Center for Environmental and Geographic Information Services (CEGIS). Mr. Muhammad Nazrul Islam, Bir Protik, MP, Hon'ble State Minister, Ministry of Water Recourses, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, graced the occasion as Chief Guest. While Dr. Zafar Ahmed Khan, Senior Secretary, Ministry of Water Recourses, was the Special Guest. The Seminar was chaired by Mr. Md. Jahangir Kabir, Director General of Bangladesh Water Development Board (BWDB) and Chairman, BANCID. The Seminar was attended by eminent water experts and engineers from different government and non-government organization, academicians and representatives from NGOs.

Keynote papers on the theme "Wastewater" were presented by Dr. Md. Mujibur Rahman, Professor, BUET; and Engr. Taqsem A. Khan, Managing Director of Dhaka Water Supply & Sewerage Authority (WASA). The following recommendations emerged from the seminar:

- Increasing awareness among all stakeholders is very much essential so that they do not discharge any type of waste or pollutant into the surrounding

rivers, canals and any other water bodies without proper treatment.

- Enormous opportunities can be explored from safely managed wastewater and fecal sludge as potentially affordable and sustainable sources of water, energy, nutrients and other recoverable materials.
- Proper management of wastewater will also provide benefits to human health, economic development and environmental sustainability- providing new business opportunities and create more 'green' jobs.
- Awareness building among the vulnerable groups, especially women and children about the risk of partially treated or untreated wastewater is an urgent need.
- Capacity building and knowledge enhancement of the concerned organizations for improved wastewater management and sanitation are necessary.
- Urgent steps should be taken by the concerned authority to prevent encroachment and pollution of the rivers of Bangladesh.

Pakistan (PANCID)

PANCID has reported that the Pakistan Council of Research in Water Resources (PCRWR), Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of Pakistan, together with its partners (Metropolitan Corporation Islamabad, Ministry of Climate Change, ECO Science Foundation, ICIMOD, Riphah International University, UNESCO Water Chair, IUCN, CCRD and LEAD) celebrated the World Water Day 2017 on 20 March 2017 in Islamabad along with poster competition on water conservation, wastewater management etc.

On this occasion Mr. Muhammad Azam Khan, Deputy Mayor of Islamabad highlighted the groundwater depletion, water shortage and waste water management which have the major problems in the Capital. While Dr. Muhammad Ashraf, Chairman of PCRWR informed that UN-Water declared the theme of World Water Day 2017 "Wastewater". The

representatives from UNESCO, ICIMOD, IUCN, LEAD Pakistan, NARC, NUST, ECO-SF and Riphah International University were also present and made their presentations during the event.

USPCAS-AFS organized World Water Day

An 'International Seminar on World Water Day 2017: Wastewater' jointly organized by U.S. Pakistan Center for Advanced Studies in Agriculture & Food Security (USPCAS-AFS), Water Management Research Centre and Dept. of Irrigation & Drainage-Faculty of Agri. Engg. & Technology in collaboration with International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI) on 25 March 2017 at University of Agriculture, Faisalabad. More than 200 participants attended the seminar.

Prof. Dr. Iqar Ahmad Khan, Vice Chancellor of the University graced the event as Chief Guest, while Er. Syed Zahid Aziz, Managing Director of WASA-Faisalabad was the Keynote Speaker. The 'Welcome Address' was made by Dr. Syed Hamid Hussain Shah, Director of WMRC and briefed the theme of World Water Day. He further emphasized on the need of safe disposal and reuse of wastewater for agriculture after proper treatment.

Dr. Syed Zahid Aziz, Managing Director of WASA-Faisalabad delivered his Keynote Address and emphasized on issues like wastewater production and treatment statistics for Faisalabad city. Engr. Haroon Rasheed, Lecturer in Dept. of Structures and Environmental Engineering made a presentation on doctoral research work in the area of wastewater. He highlighted the problems caused by industrial effluents when disposed to drains without treatment. He especially emphasized on their adverse impacts on soil and groundwater and presented a case study of tannery areas in Kasur district



Climate Change and Adaptation

The Tamil Nadu Agricultural University (TNAU) organized an International Conference on “Climate Change and Food Security” as a part of the ongoing international collaborative programme ClimaAdapt (www.climaadapt.org) from 11-12 May 2017 at Chennai, India. More than 100 professionals attended the conference.

TNAU is undertaking ClimaAdapt programme in coordination with Norwegian Institute of Bio economy Research (NIBIO), Water Resource Organizations, Irrigation Management Training Institute (IMTI), M.S.Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF), Water and Land Management Training and Research Institute (WALAMTARI) and International Water Management Research Institute (IWMI). The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Norway through the Royal Norwegian Embassy, New Delhi, funds the project.

The two-day conference provided a platform to elucidate the project results to wide audience including scientists, policy makers, administrators, farmers and other stakeholders. This program has helped in developing protocols/agreements for replicating significant outcomes of ClimaAdapt to similar locations.

The inaugural sessional started with a welcome note by Dr. V. Geethalakshmi, Professor, TNAU; Opening remarks by Dr. Nagothu Udaya Sekhar, Professor, International Department, NIBIO; Releasing the ClimaAdapt policy briefs by Mr. L. Narayan Reddy, Director General, WALAMTARI. In addition, special addresses



by Dr. M.S. Swaminathan, Founder Chairman, MSSRF; and Secretary General Avinash Tyagi. The inaugural address was delivered by Dr. N.S. Rathore, Deputy Director General, Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR).

The conference witnessed keynote addresses of Dr. Kalanithy Vairavamoorthy, DDC (Research), IWMI on topic ‘Adaptation to climate change: Increasing necessity for a water secure world; Dr. Sonali McDermid, Scientist, New York University on topic ‘Climate change projections: Multi model approach to address uncertainty issues; Dr. V. Geethalakshmi, Professor, TNAU on topic ‘ClimaAdapt: Regional integrated assessment of climate change impacts on rice production over Cauvery and Krishna river basins’; and Dr. Himanshu Pathak, Director, National Rice Research

Institute on topic ‘Greenhouse gas emission mitigation from agriculture sector.

The conference was covered in a total six sessions, (1) Climate change and variability, modelling and reducing uncertainty; (2) Climate change adaptation; (3) Climate change mitigation; (4) Climate change, capacity building & gender mainstreaming; (5) Farmer connectivity, knowledge transfer through ICT tools; and (6) Climate financing and polity; covering 23 presentations. A panel discussion on ‘Climate smart technologies and small holder’s adaptation’ was also organized during the conference.
